Wellbeing Is Not a Benefit. It's a Leadership Standard.

For years, employee wellbeing has been treated as a support function – a set of initiatives designed to make people feel better at work. Gym memberships. Wellness days. Occasional check-ins. Well-intentioned, but fundamentally mispositioned.

Because wellbeing is not a perk. It is a signal of leadership quality.

The organisations that will outperform in the next decade will not just be more efficient or more innovative. They will feel different to work in. They will be environments where people are trusted, supported, and able to perform at a high level without burning out in the process. **This is not idealism. It is strategy.**

Burnout, disengagement, and attrition are not employee problems. They are organisational outcomes. They are the result of how work is designed, how leaders behave, and what cultures tolerate. When people consistently feel overwhelmed, undervalued, or replaceable, performance does not just decline – it becomes unsustainable. And in today's market, **unsustainable performance is a liability.**

The most effective leaders understand a simple truth: You cannot demand high performance from people you systematically exhaust. Sustainable performance requires more than targets and incentives. It requires an environment where people can bring their best – repeatedly, consistently, and over time. This is where wellbeing shifts from initiative to infrastructure.

At Great Place To Work, our research (see next page) continues to show that high-trust workplaces outperform their peers across critical business metrics – from retention to productivity to long-term financial performance. But what sits underneath high-trust cultures is often overlooked:

People feel cared for. People feel heard. People feel psychologically safe enough to contribute fully. That is wellbeing in practice.

The conversation, therefore, must change.

The question is no longer: "What wellbeing initiatives do we offer?"

The real question is: "What kind of experience do our people have every day?"

Because that **experience is what drives behaviour.**

And behaviour is what drives results.

For leaders, this requires a shift in standard. Not adding more programs. Not increasing communication. But rethinking how work itself is structured:

- Are expectations sustainable?
- Are managers equipped to lead humans, not just tasks?
- Is performance rewarded at the expense of wellbeing – or alongside it?

These are harder questions. But they are the ones that matter.

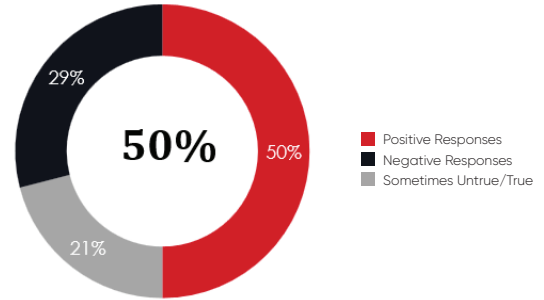
The organisations being recognised today are not perfect. But they are intentional. They have made a decision: That performance and wellbeing are not competing priorities – they are interconnected. And in making that decision, they have positioned themselves for something most organisations struggle to achieve: Consistent, repeatable, human-centred performance.

Wellbeing is not soft. It is not secondary. And it is certainly not optional. It is a leadership standard. And the organisations that understand this will not only build better workplaces – they will build more enduring businesses.

The State of Employee Wellbeing in Nigeria: Insights from the National Wellbeing Survey

The national survey on employee wellbeing in Nigeria conducted by Great Place To Work, highlights that holistic health is now a vital driver of organizational performance and sustainability. Utilizing a structured Likert scale to assess five key wellbeing metrics, the research captures a broad view of the current workplace landscape. Findings reveal a significant gap: only 50% of Nigerian employees report positive wellbeing. This mixed result signals an urgent opportunity for organizations to improve the employee experience to ensure long-term success.

Key Insight: 1 in 2 employees report positive wellbeing at work, while the remaining half experience either inconsistent or poor wellbeing.



50% of respondents reported positive wellbeing experiences, 21% remained neutral, reflecting inconsistent experiences and 29% reported negative experiences, indicating gaps in workplace wellbeing efforts.

Workplace Wellbeing Experience

Analysis of the five wellbeing statements reveals varying employee experiences across organisations. While some employees feel supported and valued, a notable proportion report inconsistencies in how wellbeing is prioritised.

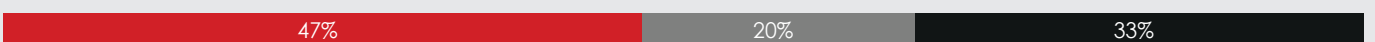

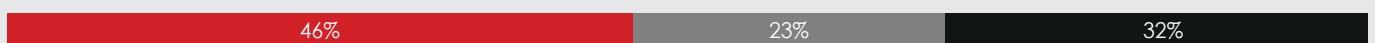

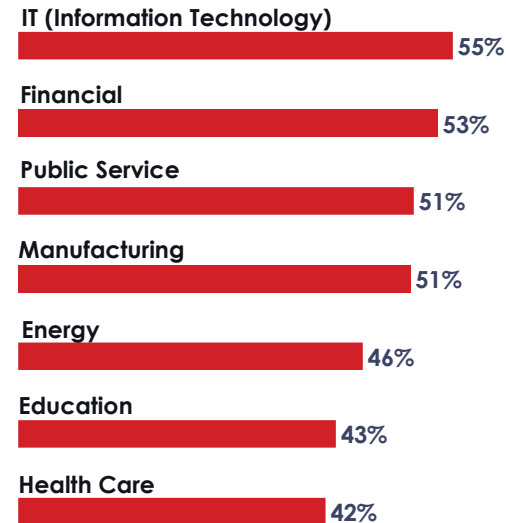


The notable share of neutral responses indicates that wellbeing practices are not yet consistently embedded across many organisations, while the remaining negative responses point to a lack of formal wellbeing structures within their workplaces.

Demographic Insights

Survey findings indicate that employee wellbeing varies significantly across gender, industries, and work structures. Sector-specific analysis reveals that Information Technology (IT) professionals report the highest levels of wellbeing, whereas those in the Healthcare industry experience the lowest.

Average of Wellbeing Score by Industry



Employees that work in IT (Information Technology) report slightly higher Wellbeing scores (55%) while workers in the Health Care Industry had the lowest Wellbeing Score (42%).

The disparity in wellbeing scores between sectors is driven by their distinct work environments:

IT Sector: Benefits from flexible work arrangements, high digital tool adoption for efficiency, and a strong focus on workplace culture.

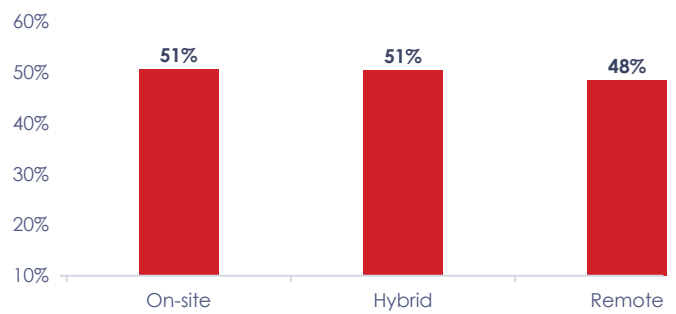
Healthcare Sector: Characterized by high-pressure environments, irregular hours, and intense physical and emotional demands.

These challenging conditions in healthcare necessitate targeted interventions to improve employee wellbeing.

Work Structure and Wellbeing

The survey insights indicates that wellbeing is similar across work arrangements, with remote employees experiencing slightly lower levels than their onsite and hybrid counterparts.

Average of Wellbeing Scores by Work Status



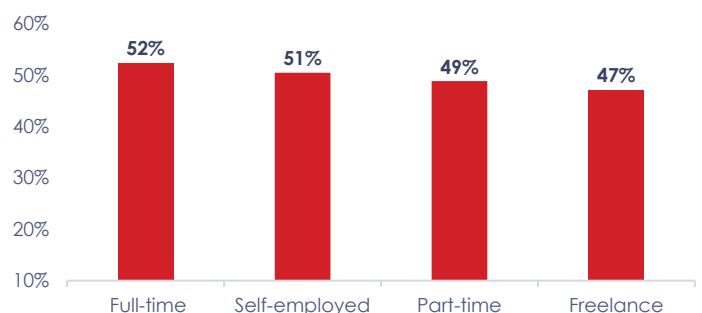
Employees that work On-site and Hybrid report slightly higher Wellbeing scores (51%) while Remote workers score slightly lower (48%).

Remote work introduces challenges such as social isolation, blurred work-life boundaries, and limited access to organizational support. In contrast, onsite and hybrid models tend to offer better opportunities for collaboration, clearer routines, and greater visibility of available resources. These factors explain why remote employees in Nigeria report slightly lower wellbeing levels than their counterparts.

Employment Type and Wellbeing

Wellbeing scores vary by employment type, with full-time employees reporting the highest levels due to job stability and organizational support. Self-employed individuals follow closely, as their professional autonomy is often tempered by income uncertainty. Conversely, freelancers report the lowest wellbeing (47%) due to poor job security and lack of benefits. To improve these outcomes, organizations should offer freelancers more inclusive support, including structured contracts, timely payments, and access to mental health resources.

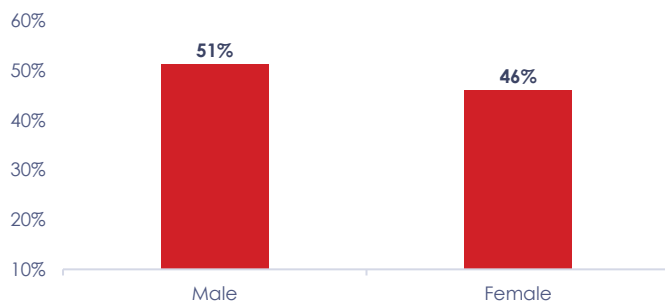
Average of Wellbeing Scores by Employment Type



Gender and Wellbeing

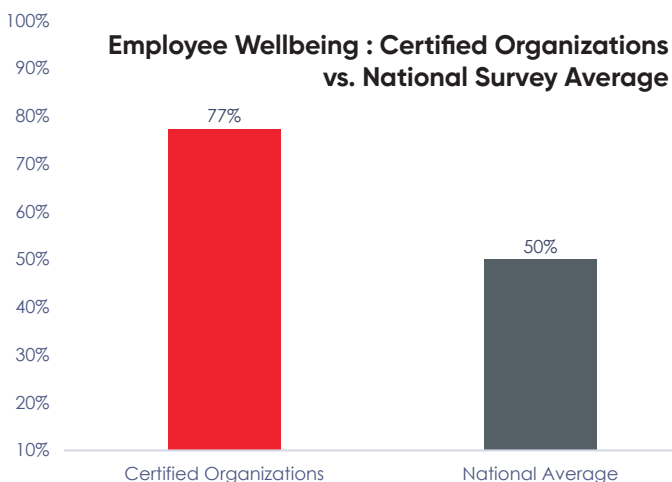
Male employees report slightly higher wellbeing scores (51%) than female employees (46%), revealing a gender gap in workplace experience. To address this disparity, organizations should implement targeted strategies such as fostering psychological safety, providing mentorship, and offering flexible work arrangements. Additionally, increasing female leadership representation and utilizing data-driven monitoring can help create a more equitable environment that meets the unique needs of women.

Average of Wellbeing Scores by Employment Type



Certified Organisations vs National Benchmark

A comparison with Great Place to Work® certified organisations highlights a significant gap: Certified organisations significantly outperform the National average, demonstrating that a strong culture of wellbeing is both achievable and impactful.



Employees in certified organizations report significantly higher wellbeing (77%) than the National Wellbeing average (50%), a difference that underscores the value of strong workplace culture practices.

Why Employee Wellbeing Matters

Historically, wellbeing has often been seen as a “nice-to-have” rather than a core business priority. However, growing evidence shows that organisations that intentionally prioritise employee wellbeing build stronger foundations for sustained, long-term success.

At Great Place To Work®, our research consistently shows that organizations that invest in trust, fairness, and employee wellbeing build more resilient, high-performing workplaces, where higher levels of wellbeing are strongly linked to increased employee productivity, engagement, and overall business performance.



Conclusion

The findings from the National Wellbeing Survey highlight a clear opportunity for organisations across Nigeria to rethink and strengthen their approach to employee wellbeing. While Certified organisations are setting the standard, the broader workforce experience reveals significant room for improvement. Closing this gap will require intentional efforts, consistent practices, and a commitment to creating environments where employees can truly thrive.
